

Erasmus – Mobility for studies (KA131/2022) – academic year 2022/23 Additional round of Applications (2nd round) for Erasmus+ mobility for studies

Applications for the remaining available places (studies in the second semester, with an Erasmus grant)

Students can apply for an Erasmus+ grant for studies at a host university in the second semester of 2022/23 provided the mobility is carried out <u>abroad</u> (in the country of the host institution) in form of face-to-face (on-site), virtual (on-line) or blended (hybrid) learning.

The minimum length of the mobility abroad must be **60 days** (shorter stays are not allowed). The Erasmus grant for the mobility depends on the destination:

- **550 EUR** per month Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Norway, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain;
- **450 EUR** per month Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, North Macedonia, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Turkey, Hungary.

Students receiving a **UW social benefit** at the moment of application and students with **disabilities** will receive an additional top-up of **250 EUR** per month.

Applications will be processed by the International Relations Office (IRO) on an **ongoing basis**, in the order they were received until there are places available or up to the nomination deadline of the host university.

The final decision on whether the candidate will be accepted and how the teaching will be conducted in the second semester (on-site, on-line or in a blended way) is up to the **host university.**

1. Terms and conditions

- at least one year of completed university studies is required;
- GPA (grade point average) of at least **3,49 for the last academic year (2021/22)** is mandatory and **not more than 1 conditional pass** is allowed;
- a proof of language competence at the level required by the host university is obligatory (please check the language requirements for Erasmus students on the website of the university of your choice <u>before</u> sending the application to IRO).
- priority will be given to students whose field of study corresponds to the field of study foreseen in the Erasmus+ interinstitutional agreement with the host university (see the attached list of available places, grouped according to particular departments/ fields of study);
- students who have already been assigned an Erasmus mobility in **this year's first round** of applications CANNOT apply.

2. Documents required

- 2.1 Application form completed and signed. The application must contain:
 - a) the name of the host university with its ERASMUS code and the name of the **Department / Faculty** where you would like to study in the second semester (you can choose up to **2 universities**) please **make sure that the university of your choice offers courses corresponding to your field of study** at UW.



b) a brief justification of your choice of the host university

Your application must be signed by the Erasmus mobility coordinator at your home department institute (http://bwz.uw.edu.pl/lista-koordynatorow-ds-mobilnosci/)

Students of Kolegium MISH (Interdisciplinary Individual Studies in the Humanities) or MISMaP (Interfaculty Individual Studies in Mathematics and Natural Sciences) must have their application signed by the mobility coordinator of the department relevant to their major area of studies <u>as well as the mobility coordinator at MISH or MISMaP respectively.</u>

Applicants from Doctoral Schools must have their applications signed by the relevant mobility coordinator at the Doctoral School as well as the Director of the Doctoral School.

- 2.2. A certificate with your GPA calculated for the last academic year and a certificate stating whether or not you have any conditional passes ('warunek' in Polish) at the department/ institute which is nominating you for the mobility (available at your students' office Dziekanat / Sekretariat)
- 2.3 A proof of having sufficient language competence in the language of instruction at the host university (at this stage we will accept any document stating the required level, however the host university may require a particular type of certificate in order to accept he candidate).
- 2.4 A declaration of whether you have participated in ERASMUS+ and/or Erasmus Mundus before, while studying at UW or other universities.

Please note! Students starting their second-cycle studies at University of Warsaw in the 2022/23 academic year can apply for mobility only when they have been registered in USOS by the respective students' offices at their departments.

- 3. End of the additional round of applications 14th October 2022.
- 4. How to submit the documents?

5. <u>All students will be informed</u> by email about the results of the recruitment process. Applications will be processed on an ongoing basis, in the order they were received. They will be assessed with respect to completeness of the required documents, and – if applicable - the host university's consent to make an exceptional deviation from the existing inter-institutional Erasmus+agreement (a request for such a consent will be sent to the host university by IRO UW).
