	Our academic departments will determine which courses an exchange
	student is approved to take. Each department has their own criteria when

assessing course requests, the <u>most important of which is whether a student</u> has the required academic background to meet the course prerequisites.

<u>REMINDERS:</u> 1) A student may not be approved to take all of the courses they have requested on their application. This can be due to a number of factors, including but not limited to: course is restricted and not open to exchange students, course is full, course is not offered in correct exchange term, course is cancelled, course conflicts with other registered courses or the student does not meet the academic prerequisites to take the course.

2) Students requesting **full year courses** must be prepared to complete both terms of the course (i.e. Fall 2022 <u>and</u> Winter 2023) in order to receive academic credit for the course. This applies even if the course is offered online.

Health Insurance (UHIP)	UHIP: All students are required to enroll in the <u>mandatory</u> University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP). Charges will automatically be applied to the student account upon course registration.

Visa Requirements

If your studies in Canada will be <u>less than 6 months</u>, you may study as a visitor without having a study permit.

Most international students need a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) *or* Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to travel to Canada. <u>The Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada website</u> has a tool to help you determine which you need and lead you to the correct online application. This letter may be used in a TRV application to explain the purpose of your visit to Canada.

If you plan to study in Canada for <u>more than 6 months</u>, you must apply for a study permit. Your application for a study permit is automatically your application for a TRV or eTA as well.

The <u>ISSO's website</u> tells you how to start the online study permit application process and provides helpful tips. Requirements for the application vary by country, but all students will need a valid passport, a Carleton Letter of Acceptance and proof of having sufficient resources to cover expenses in Canada. Students will probably have to give <u>biometrics</u>, and may need to get a medical exam and/or police certificate(s). **Students should gather their documents and submit their application as soon as possible.**

All students over the age of 18 must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and meet all <u>current COVID-19 travel requirements</u> in order to travel to Canada.
