STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM APPLICATION MATERIAL

- Online Application Form
 - Fall Semester/Academic Year: March 15
 - Spring Semester: October 1
 - Late applicants are reviewed on a rolling basis and are subjected to extremely limited course availability
- English Proficiency
 - TOEFL (79 overall), IELTS (6.5 overall) or Duolingo (105 min) Score Report
 - Graduate-level students are subjected to higher score requirements
 - Other forms of English Proficiency are acceptable
 - waived for students from countries with English as the official language
- Official Transcripts either by post or email from Home Institution
- J-1 Immigration Requirements
 - Copy of biographic page of valid Passport
 - Financial Evidence of Support (certified Bank Statement & COF Form)
 - Health Insurance is required, either students can stay enrolled in the Suffolk Plan or waive out with comparable coverage. Please read specifics here

ADMISSIONS POLICY

A review of a student's academic background and University record is required as part of the Suffolk University Study Abroad admissions process. To be considered for admission to our programs, students should have, at the time of application, a cumulative grade point **average (GPA) of at least 2.50 on a 4.00 scale**. Meeting or exceeding the minimum cumulative GPA requirement, however, does not guarantee admission to a program. Admissions decisions are based on a full review of the file. Once admitted, students who are not in good standing or determined by the University not to be in compliance with any academic requirement or other rule, requirement or procedure of the University may be precluded from participation in a Suffolk Study Abroad Program. **All admission decisions are final.**
