## LENGTH OF STUDY

You can choose to study for a semester or a full year at Le Moyne College. The Fall Semester runs August to December and the Spring Semester runs January to May.

## ASSESSMENT

Students are assessed using a variety of measures, including term papers, book reports, quizzes, and participation in class discussion.

Students are assigned letter grades from A-F which are converted to grade points at the course- and semester-level as shown below:

## How to Apply

You need to be nominated by the study abroad office at your home institution in order to apply. Once nominated, Le Moyne will send you an application pack via email. You will be asked to submit a number of documents, including a copy of the photo-ID page in your passport, an academic transcript, a personal statement, a reference letter, and financial information.

**COURSE SELECTION:** You will receive a **Course Preferences form** in the application pack. To complete this form, you should review the course schedule (available [here](#)) for the upcoming semester and select a minimum of 6-8 courses. Most courses are worth 3 credits and you should take between 12-18 credits per semester.



## AIRPORT PICK-UP

Exchange students can contact the Office of Global Education to arrange pick-up from Syracuse Hancock International Airport.

## ORIENTATION

An orientation for new exchange and international students is held at the start of each semester to highlight student services and visa guidelines.

## PROGRAMMING

The Office of Global Education organizes excursions around Central New York for exchange and international students.

## Health Information

Exchange students are not required to have a health insurance policy, however it is strongly recommended that you purchase a plan with international coverage. Students will also need to submit a [health report and immunization record](#) before arriving on campus.

## Visa Information

A student visa is required to study in the U.S. Once Le Moyne approves your enrollment, we will register your information with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and issue you with a Form I-20. This form is needed to apply for a student visa at your nearest U.S. consulate or embassy. ## Accommodation

Exchange students are typically housed in our apartment-style buildings. While the layout varies, most apartments have double rooms with a shared living room, kitchen, and bathroom. Facilities include a twin-sized bed, desk, desk chair, and wardrobe. Bedding is not supplied.

## Living Expenses

**HOUSING:** Accommodation costs **\$4,880 per semester**. This fee is paid at the beginning of each semester and includes WiFi and utilities.

**MEALS:** Exchange students who do not wish to cook are entitled to purchase a [Meal Plan](#). Le Moyne estimates that students spend **\$2,950 per semester** on meals.

**OTHER:** Le Moyne estimates that students spend **\$1,345 per semester** on books, transportation, toiletries, and miscellaneous expenses.

## Recreation Center

Use of the [Fitness Room](#) is free to all current students. Equipment includes weight-lifting machines, treadmills, ellipticals, and exercise bikes. There are a number of free fitness classes held each week, including yoga, barre, and spin classes.
