- my work shall not be used in an offensive, unethical, or otherwise dignity-violating manner.

I confirm that the processing of my personal data and competition entry for the aforementioned purposes does not violate my personal rights.

I am aware that I may at any time request access to materials in which my work has been published.

I confirm that I have read the information on personal data processing in connection with the “FotoErasmus+ 2025 – third edition” photo contest, available at www.bwz.uw.edu.pl, and understand my rights regarding access, correction, restriction of processing, and withdrawal of consent at any time.

Information on the processing of personal data

Data administrator

Data Protection Officer (DPO)

The administrator has appointed a Data Protection Officer, whom you can contact by e-mail at: iod@adm.uw.edu.pl.

The DPO can be contacted in all matters regarding the processing of your personal data by the University of Warsaw and your exercise of rights related to the processing of personal data.

However, the tasks of the DPO do not include the implementation of other matters, such as providing information on the competition, accepting competition entries, examining complaints and applications regarding the competition, etc.

Purposes and legal basis for processing

Your personal data will be processed in order to implement the "FotoErasmus+ 2026 – fourth edition" photo competition.

In the case of persons whose photographs will be awarded, personal data in the field of name, surname, UW unit may be published on the administrator's website.

The basis for the processing of personal data is the consent to the processing of personal data (Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR¹). After the end of the competition, the personal data of the participants will be processed for archival purposes on the basis of the legitimate interest of the Data Administrator, which is, among others, establishing, pursuing and defending claims (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR).

Personal data of winners receiving cash or other material prizes will be additionally processed in order to fulfill the tax and accounting obligations resulting from generally applicable provisions of law (Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR).

Consent can be withdrawn at any time, e.g. by sending an e-mail to the address: erasmusbwz.uw.edu.pl. We would like to remind you that the withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of the processing that was made on the basis of the consent before its withdrawal.

Data retention period

Your data will be processed for the duration of the competition, and after its completion for a period of 5 years from the end of the project under which the competition is financed (i.e. until the end of 2028).

Data recipients

Access to your personal data will be granted to authorized employees, associates or students of the University of Warsaw who must process your data in connection with the ongoing competition.

The recipients of your data may also be entities to which the Administrator will commission specific activities in connection with the competition, which involve the need to process personal data, such as the National Agency of the Erasmus+ Program and the European Solidarity Corps (NA) and the European Commission, taking into account the need to transfer data the relevant services responsible for controls and audits in accordance with EU legislation⁽¹⁾ (European Court of Auditors or European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF))

Data transfer outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

Your data may also be processed by our provider of the G-Suit for education service, Google (with whom we have signed an agreement to entrust the processing of personal data) in its data processing centers².

Rights related to data processing

We guarantee you the implementation of all your rights on the terms set out in the GDPR, i.e. the right to:

- access your data and receive a copy thereof;
- rectify (correct) your personal data;
- restrict the processing of your personal data;
- delete your personal data (subject to Article 17(3) of the GDPR);
- withdraw the consent to the processing of personal data;
- lodge a complaint with the President of the Data Protection Office if you believe that the processing of personal data violates the provisions of the law on the protection of personal data.

Obligation to provide data and the consequence of not providing data

Providing data is necessary to participate in the competition. Failure to provide data results in the inability to participate in the competition.
